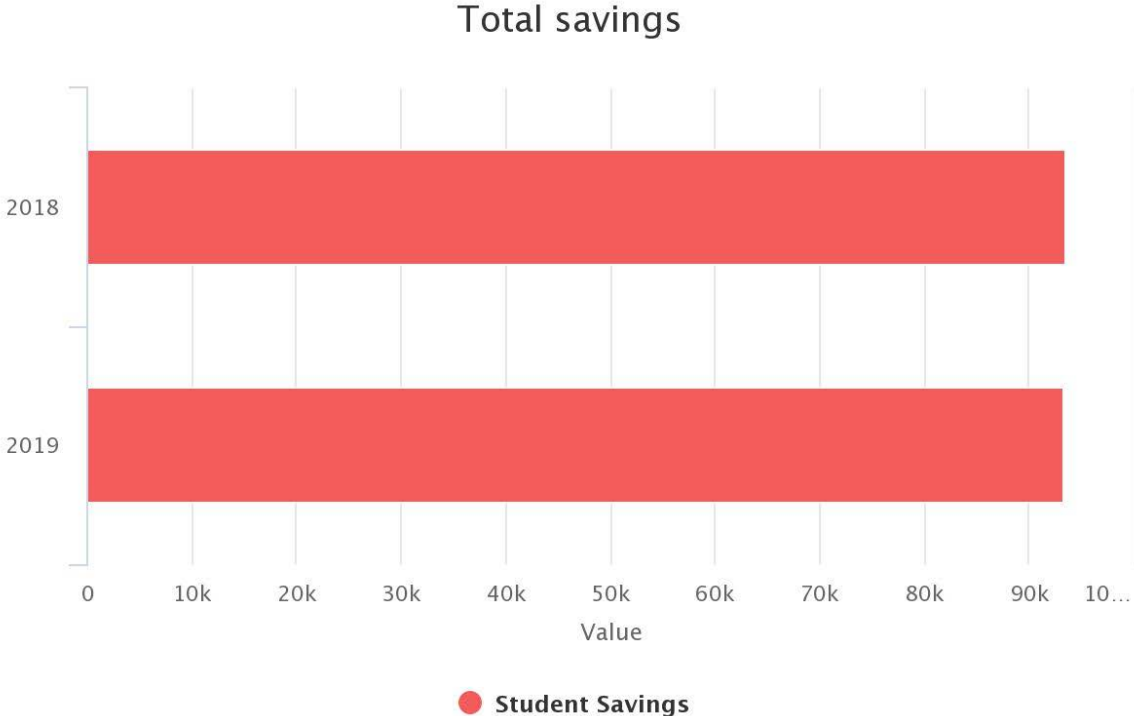
RVCC Student Savings

Rowan University Student Savings

Estimated to save \$116,181 in 2019 with five grants of \$2,000 each

Increased funding allowed for ten grants, estimated to save \$1.2 million in 2020
